



Qualsafe Paediatric First Aid – Level 3 Award (RQF)

Who should attend?

This qualification is for people who have a specific responsibility at work, or in voluntary and community activities, to provide first aid to children (including babies) when dealing with:

- An emergency situation
- Chronic or sudden paediatric illness
- Paediatric injury

Course Aims & Objectives

The objective of the qualification is to benefit Learners by enabling them to attain the knowledge and practical competencies needed to deal with a range of first aid situations when looking after children.

By the end of the course delegates will:

- Understand the role and responsibilities of the paediatric first aider
- Be able to:
 - assess an emergency situation safely
 - provide first aid for an infant or a child who is unresponsive and breathing normally
 - provide first aid for an infant or a child who is unresponsive and not breathing normally
 - provide first aid for an infant or a child who is choking
 - provide first aid to an infant or a child with external bleeding
 - provide first aid to an infant or a child who is suffering from shock
 - administer first aid to an infant or a child with a suspected fracture
 - administer first aid to an infant or a child with head, neck or back injury
- Understand how to:
 - administer first aid to an infant or a child with bites, stings and minor injuries
 - administer first aid to an infant or a child with conditions affecting the eyes, ears and nose
 - administer emergency first aid to an infant or a child with an acute medical condition or sudden illness
 - administer first aid to an infant or a child who is experiencing the effects of extreme heat and cold
 - administer first aid to an infant or a child who has sustained an electric shock
 - administer first aid to an infant or a child with burns or scalds
 - administer first aid to an infant or a child who has been poisoned
 - provide first aid to an infant or a child with anaphylaxis

Certification

Delegates are assessed throughout the course by the trainer and need to complete a written assessment at the end of the course. Successful delegates will receive a Quallsafe Level 3 Award in Paediatric First Aid Certificate. Certificates are valid for 3 years and then delegates will need to re-sit the qualification to remain qualified (this must be attended no later than 28 days after the expiry on the original certificate).
